Introduction to GIS.

Survey of urban design methods associated with practice and research.

**CPLN 647** *Negotiation and Civic Engagement*  
Use of bargaining, negotiation, and consensus building techniques to address public planning issues.

Use of statistical techniques and regression analysis to analyze planning data sets and problems.

Design of planning & public policy research including quantitative, qualitative, archival, case study, survey research, and quasi-experimental methods.

**CPLN 701** *Planning Studio*  
Offers an advanced problem-solving exercise that involves comprehensive planning.

**CPLN 723** *Law of Planning and Urban Development*  
Examines the fundamentals of planning law.
