Biographical/Historical Sketch

Born Charles-Édouard Jeanneret, Le Corbusier (1887-1965) studied engraving at the School of Applied Arts, La Chaux-de-Fonds, Switzerland. He worked in the offices of Auguste Perret (1908-10) and briefly for Peter Behrens (1910) before establishing an office in Paris. One of the central figures in the evolution of modern architecture, Le Corbusier is remembered for many significant buildings and projects realized throughout Europe, India, Japan and the Americas, as well as for his seminal book *Vers une Architecture* of 1923.

Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of one drawing, signed and dated 8 May 1935, pastel on vellum, $35 \times 116 \frac{1}{2}$ inches. It is not known, at this time, where the drawing was made or what subject it depicts.
