## **Biographical/Historical Sketch**

Mildred Schmertz was born on March 25, 1925 in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. She received her Bachelor of Architecture from Carnegie Mellon University, then known as Carnegie Institute of Technology. Schmertz worked as a draftsperson and renderer under John Schurko, a Pittsburgh architect, for eight years. She then explored her interest in graphic arts (photography, typography) while attending Yale University and earned a Master's degree in Fine Arts. Schmertz worked in the art department of *The Architectural Record* during summers while studying at Yale and advanced to full time after she graduated. Upon graduation, she obtained her license to practice architecture in New York State.

In 1985, Schmertz became the first female editor-in-chief of a professional architectural publication. She worked for *The Architectural Record* from 1957 until her retirement in 1990 but continued to write for the publication until 2010.

Schmertz is responsible for some of the most notable photography of Louis I. Kahn's Richards Medical Research Laboratories, which is considered the breakthrough project of his career. In addition to her photography and writing, she was a visiting lecturer at the Yale School of Architecture and the Graduate Program in Architecture and Design Criticism in the New School at Parsons School of Design. She served as commissioner for the New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission from 1988 to 1991.

Mildred Schmertz died on January 9, 2018 at the age of 92.

## **Scope and Content Note**

This collection contains materials related to the professional work of Mildred Schmertz, an architect, photographer, writer and editor. It measures approximately six linear feet and includes architectural and travel photography, correspondence, and research and writings. It also contains chapters for an unpublished book on architect Benjamin Thompson, materials related to the Aga Khan Award for Architecture, general correspondence, and papers regarding her work at *The Architectural Record*.

Highlights of the collection include photography of Louis I. Kahn's Richards Laboratories and houses designed by Frank Lloyd Wright in Arizona.
