Abstract:	The collection comprises five architectural drawings of buildings designed by Seeler for the University of Pennsylvania and one booklet.

Biographical/Historical Sketch

Edgar V. Seeler was born in Philadelphia, PA and graduated from Central High School in 1884. He was trained in architecture at MIT (1890) and the Ecole des Beaux-Arts, Paris (1890-1893). He established his own practice in Philadelphia in 1893 and taught at the University of Pennsylvania as an assistant professor of architectural design until 1898.

His architectural practice consisted largely of commercial buildings such as the Curtis Publishing Company Building. He also designed the First Baptist Church in Philadelphia and residences outside of the city.

Scope and Content Note

The collection contains five architectural drawings for two buildings designed by Seeler for the University of Pennsylvania, one located on the West Philadelphia campus (extant, known as Hayden Hall) and another located outside Philadelphia in Delaware County, a primarily residential building. The collection also contains a booklet related to the latter project.

Materials related to Seeler are also found in other collections of the Architectural Archives. The Frank Miles Day Collection contains a remarkable large-scale rendering of Day's design for the Horticultural Hall executed by Seeler. In addition, Seeler was associated with Warren Powers Laird for two projects represented in the Warren Powers Laird Collection.
