- Abstract: The collection consists of three architectural drawings, bound together with one overlay plan, documenting Wright's design for the Robert Publicker House of 1951.

Biographical/Historical Sketch

Frank Lloyd Wright (1867-1959) was born in Richland Center, Wisconsin, and studied engineering at the University of Wisconsin, Madison for two terms. Wright apprenticed with the Chicago architect Joseph Lynman Silsbee, and then with the firm Adler and Sullivan. He first established an independent office in Oak Park, Illinois in 1893-1911, and later in Madison, Wisconsin, 1911-1959, with temporary offices in Tokyo and Los Angeles. Wright's designs had enormous influence on the development of twentieth-century architecture, and are generally best known for their open plans, sensitive use of materials, and complex massing and form.

Scope and Content Note

The collection comprises three original presentation drawings, signed and dated by Wright in April 1951, documenting his unbuilt design for the Robert Publicker House. This project would have been located on Tunbridge Road in Haverford, Pennsylvania. The drawings have been maintained as a bound presentation set with brown paper cover and interleaving. The original mailing tube (postmarked in Scottsdale, Arizona), in which this set of drawings was mailed to the client, has been preserved.
