America's Best Architecture & Design Schools

In the DesignIntelligence report *America's Best Architecture & Design Schools 2016-2017*, PennDesign's graduate program in architecture climbed to the tenth spot in the nation. PennDesign's Department of Landscape Architecture remained second only to Harvard in the overall rankings, and ranked second in the most admired graduate landscape architecture programs in a survey of 40 academic leaders at accredited programs in the US.

Facilities & Endowment

The School occupies five historic buildings on Penn's verdant campus—Charles Addams Hall (1959), the Frank Furness-designed Fisher Fine Arts Library (1890), the Franklin Building Annex (1945/1963), Meyerson Hall (1967), and the Morgan Building (1892)—as well as space in the Pennovation Works.

PennDesign has an endowment of \$88 million.
