- Abstract: This collection contains biographical, professional, and personal materials belonging to landscape architect Ian McHarg (1920-2001), and his wife, Carol McHarg. It includes date books (1959-2000); personal and professional correspondence (1950-2005); writings, lectures, and interviews; 35mm travel slides (1949-1975) as well as other photographic and audiovisual material; and architectural drawings, particularly McHarg's proposed plans for Pardisan, an environmental park in Tehran, Iran, and the National Capital of Nigeria in Abuja. This collection complements an earlier gift of McHarg's papers, Collection 109.

### **Biographical/Historical Sketch**

Ian L. McHarg, born in Clydebank, Scotland in 1920, was the founder and chairman of the department of Landscape Architecture at the University of Pennsylvania, pioneer of ecological planning, author of *Design With Nature*, and co-founder of the firm Wallace, McHarg, Roberts and Todd.

He served in World War Two as a paratrooper and demobilized at the rank of major in the British military. He received his professional education from Harvard University, earning a Master in Landscape Architecture in 1950 and a Master of City Planning in 1951. At Harvard, McHarg met Pauline (1922-1974), his first wife and mother to his two eldest sons, Alistair and Malcolm. Pauline died of leukemia in 1974.

McHarg was brought to the University of Pennsylvania by G. Holmes Perkins to re-establish the Department of Landscape Architecture in 1954. His ecological approach based upon the “layer cake method” of mapping revolutionized the field of landscape architecture both at the University of Pennsylvania and across the United States. He was a key proponent of a world ecological inventory to integrate data sets already present in organizations around the world to produce a world ecological model. His groundbreaking book *Design With Nature* disseminated his concept of ecological planning to an international audience making his ideas the foundation for many landscape architecture programs across the United States and beyond.

McHarg chaired the Department of Landscape Architecture at the University of Pennsylvania from its founding until his retirement in 1986, and continued to teach as emeritus professor until 1999. Beginning in 1959, he developed a revolutionary course “Man and the Environment” which employed interdisciplinary research to obtain a better understanding of the human relationship to the natural world. For this course McHarg invited experts from a variety of different fields to lecture to his students on (in his words) “scientific conceptions of matter, life and man; the views of God, man, and nature in the major philosophies and religions, and, last, an examination of the interaction of man and nature, mainly ecological.” He also adapted the course lecture format into the television interview series *The House We Live In*, focusing on the “evolution of matter, life and man.” The series, originally broadcast on CBS in the early 1960s, was later rebroadcast on PBS. McHarg met his second wife, Carol, in 1976 at the University of Pennsylvania during the course of her studies in Landscape Architecture. They were married a year later and had two children together, Ian and Andrew.

McHarg and his Harvard classmate David Wallace founded the design firm Wallace-McHarg Associates in 1962, commissioned by the Green Spring and Worthington Valley Planning Council to address the threat to the valleys by urban expansion of metropolitan Baltimore. Renamed Wallace, McHarg, Roberts and Todd in 1965, this design firm led the fields of city planning, urban design and landscape architecture during the 1970s by approaching design from an ecological perspective. Significant projects include the “Inner Harbor Master Plan” for Baltimore, Maryland, “A Comprehensive Landscape for Washington D.C.” and “Woodlands New Community” in Houston, Texas. McHarg established his own practice after his resignation from the firm in 1979.

McHarg was honored with numerous awards and medals, including the Harvard Lifetime Achievement Award, the National Medal of Art, the Thomas Jefferson Foundation Medal in Architecture, and the Pioneer Award from the American Institute of Certified Planners. In April 2000, he received the Japan Prize in city planning. Ian McHarg died on March 5, 2001, at the age of 80.

## Scope and Content Note

The Ian and Carol McHarg collection comprises materials donated to the Architectural Archives by his widow, Carol McHarg, which had been kept at their home in Chester County, Pennsylvania. This collection (hereafter Col. 365) complements a gift received during the summer of 2000 (hereafter cited as Col. 109) consisting of the entire contents of McHarg's office on the fourth floor of Meyerson Hall on the University of Pennsylvania's West Philadelphia campus.

The two collections overlap extensively, particularly in areas related to McHarg's professional work, writings and speaking engagements. However, Col. 365 adds resources heretofore unavailable, including McHarg's date books (1959-2000), personal and professional correspondence, including drafts and copies of outgoing correspondence, from 1950 to 2005, and, of particular note, 35mm travel slides, dating from 1949 to 1975, that capture his explorations of the American continent, in addition to his travels in Europe, Africa, Asia and beyond. Col. 365 also contains two groups of architectural drawings that document McHarg's professional work with the firm Wallace, McHarg, Roberts & Todd, during the 1970s. These include a set of rendered presentation plans for the National Capital of Nigeria in Abuja and for Pardisan, the planned environmental park in Tehran, Iran, a comprehensive set of graphic records, along with related reports and correspondence which documents the design development of the project, from initial concepts through preliminary construction drawings.

Col. 365 is divided into seven series: I. Biographical materials, II. Professional materials, III. Writings, lectures, interviews & other publications, IV. Photographic materials, V. Oversized materials, VI. Film, video and audio recordings, and VII. Drawings.

Series I includes biographical and personal materials, dating from 1947 to McHarg's death in 2001. Of particular note are McHarg's notes from Municipal and Highway Engineering, a course recounted in his autobiography *A Quest for Life*. Series I also contains Curriculum Vitae from various points throughout McHarg's career and architectural registrations from twelve states. In 2000, Ian McHarg received the Japan Prize in city planning; the press materials, correspondence, and speeches from this award are contained in Series I. A video recording of the Japan Prize banquet and award ceremony can be found in Series VI. McHarg's other awards and degrees have been separated out for storage and are located in Series V.

Series II contains McHarg's professional materials which were received with little discernable order. In processing, the original order was restored where possible, though extensive reorganization occurred to give the materials practical accessibility. This series comprises 37 of McHarg's date books, recording both personal and professional activities, dating from 1959 to 2000 (excluding the years 1962-1964, 1968, 1978, and 1993 which have not been located.) Correspondence files are divided into general correspondence and subject correspondence. General correspondence files are organized chronologically by year and contain correspondence from 1950 to his death in 2001, and later correspondence with Carol McHarg that continues into 2005. The subject correspondence files contain large sections of correspondence that were grouped together when received or were grouped afterward based on common theme, they may not be inclusive of all correspondence on that given subject. Series II also contains materials related to *The House We Live in*, the television interview series hosted by Ian McHarg, broadcast in the 1960s. Series II also contains project materials, most importantly and extensively, relating to Pardisan, the proposed environmental park in Tehran Iran that ended with the Iranian revolution and led to McHarg's forced resignation from WMRT. Also expansively included in

this series are materials related to the 1999-2000 Sustainable Development Master Plan for Nantou County, Taiwan, conducted by Ian McHarg and Lanshing Hwang.

Series III comprises writings, lectures, and interviews by Ian McHarg, as well as related materials and other publications. This series contains a selection of McHarg's poetry, including a manuscript of *Some Songs to the Stars*, a collection of his poems published in 2001. McHarg's lectures, articles, and other writings are comprised of printed materials, typescripts, manuscripts and notes that are arranged alphabetically by title. Of note are various manuscript versions of his autobiography, *A Quest for Life*, including handwritten edits. This series contains extensive handwritten notes, including article drafts, lecture notes, poetry, brainstorming, and sketches, all of which offer a glimpse at McHarg's creative process. Series III also contains extensive materials written about Ian McHarg. News clippings, dating from 1959 to 2001, are organized chronologically by year. Promotional and other written materials are arranged alphabetically.

Series IV contains photographic materials, including 35 mm slides and photographic prints. There is a division between personal and professional slides and both sections are organized chronologically. The personal travel slides of this collection contain images from early trips in the United States, Western Europe, Africa, and South America, dating from 1949 to the early 1970s. Additionally, the series contains various images of Ian, Pauline, and the McHarg children, as well as photographs of Sir Peter Shephard, Lawrence Halprin, Garrett Eckbo, Thomas Church, Eugene Feldmen, and Narendra Juneja. Series IV also comprises a small photographic print collection that includes images from *The House We Live In*, featuring Ian McHarg and Dr. Harlow Shapley. Also of note is a group of twenty images used in the production of *A Quest for Life*, mounted with page and figure numbers.

Series V contains oversized materials separated for storage, much of which has been highlighted above. McHarg's various degrees and awards, dating from 1967 to 2001 are contained here. This series also comprises oversized mounted poetry by McHarg and personal research conducted on Charles Elliot, an innovative landscape architect in the Olmsted tradition and an inspiration for McHarg. Also separated for storage are oversized project reports from "Land Use in Philadelphia 1944-1945," prepared by Thomas F. Morrow that were kept by McHarg, and reviews of *A Quest for Life* by Lawrence Halprin and Sir Peter Shepard from *The Quarterly Review of landscape Architecture and Garden Design Publications*, Winter 1996.

Series VI comprises audiovisual materials divided into audio, video, and film collections that are each organized alphabetically. This series includes various broadcasts, interviews, and lecture recordings. Of note are a pair of 16mm films of *Multiply and Subdue the Earth*, McHarg's 1969 motion picture originally aired on PBS and a 2004 film adaptation of *Some Songs to the Stars*.

Series VII contains drawings for two major projects executed by the firm of Wallace, McHarg, Roberts and Todd, including presentation drawings for the Nigerian Federal Capital Master Plan, dating from 1978 and, more extensively, design, presentation, and preliminary construction drawings for Pardisan, an environmental park in Tehran, Iran, dating from 1974-78. These objects supplement items contained in the Archives' Thomas Todd Collection, particularly, for the Nigerian Federal Capital Master Plan project.

In processing this collection and preparing the finding aid, Architectural Archives staff have depended heavily on Ian McHarg. *A Quest For Life*. New York: John Wiley and Sons, 1996.
