Ann Beha's work is marked by its strong cultural and educational content and its advocacy for the integration of contemporary design within historic settings. Many of Ann's projects consider history and heritage in new ways, addressing new technology, culture, and emerging community needs.

Based in Boston, Ann Beha Architects has received numerous national and international design awards for establishing interplay of preservation with new design expression. ABA is currently designing projects for the US State Department, for the US Embassy in Athens, the Smithsonian Institution, Harvard and Yale Universities, and the New England Conservatory of Music. In her practice, Ann had the exceptional honor of collaborating with Pamela Hawkes, now professor or Practice at Penn, for over 25 years.

Ann Beha is a graduate of Wellesley College, holds a Master of Architecture Degree from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and was a Loeb Fellow at the Graduate School of Design at Harvard University. She has been Distinguished Visiting Professor of Architecture at the City College of New York. For the seventh consecutive year, ABA has been named one of the top 50 architectural practices in the United States by *ARCHITECT* Magazine, cited for its design leadership, stewardship, and collaborative practice.
