# **What's Your Voting Plan?**

# **VOTER REGISTRATION and MAIL-IN/ABSENTEE BALLOT INFORMATION** for Weitzman Students, Faculty and Staff

## Important Dates:

- General Election is on November 3, 2020.
  - o Polls are open in PA on election day from 7 A.M. to 8 P.M.
- Last day to <u>register to vote</u> in PA: October 19, 2020
- Mail-in and Absentee Ballot Applications for PA must be submitted online OR received by your county election office by 5pm, Tuesday, October 27, 2020
- Mail-in and Absentee Ballot Return deadlines and protocols for PA are shifting a tad and will be updated with accurate information soon.

DO YOU HAVE A VOTING PLAN?

STEP 1: Decide where you will or need to vote.

This is more complicated than usual given the disruption of the COVID-19 pandemic to our housing situations.

#### TWO INITIAL QUESTIONS

- Where are you currently living?
- Where are you currently registered?
  - o Confirm voter registration in PA here: VotesPA.com/Status
  - If you are not registered in PA or are not sure where you are registered, get information from other states: VOTE 411

#### IF THEN. WHAT? SCENARIOS

- If you lived in Philadelphia and are currently registered to vote here but have been displaced by COVID to another state temporarily, you may
  - Vote in PA by mail/absentee ballot, OR
  - Change your voter registration to the state in which you are currently residing
- If you lived in Philadelphia and are currently registered to vote here but have been displaced by COVID to another county in PA temporarily, you may
  - Vote in Phila by mail/absentee ballot (make sure ballot is sent to current address) OR
  - Change the address on your voter registration to the county in which you are currently residing and either vote in-person or by mail-in ballot
- If you've moved to another address in Philadelphia since the last time you voted, you can
  - Change the address on your voter registration (see below) OR
  - Vote by mail/absentee ballot (make sure ballot is sent to current address)
  - Vote in-person at your previous polling place/old address
- If you moved to Philadelphia to start school and/or to work at Penn and have not yet voted in PA, you are eligible to register and vote in PA in-person or by mail-in ballot.
- If you started attending or began working at Penn but have not yet moved to PA, you are eligible to vote in PA only if you move and establish residency 30 days prior to the election on November 3<sup>rd</sup>.

## STEP 2: Register to vote, update your registration OR skip to Step 3

- If you need to register to vote in PA for the first time, whether because you are voting for the first time or changing your voter registration from another state
  - Use <u>this</u> online application or register <u>here</u> via Penn Leads the Vote OR
  - Print out <u>this</u> paper application and mail it to your county voter registration office or drop off at a <u>satellite</u> election office near you
  - FOR ALL QUESTIONS this guide from Votes PA is super helpful
- If you need to change the address, your name or your party on your PA voter registration?

- If you need to change your voter registration from PA to another state or get a firsttime registration in your home state
  - Check this <u>website</u> for nationwide voter registration deadlines by state and check with your state's voter services website

PLEASE NOTE: If you are registering in PA for the first time and DO NOT have a PA Driver's License or PennDOT ID number, you will be asked to submit the last 4 digits of your Social Security Number and, if applying online, to upload a signature. If you do not have the means to do so, print out and complete the paper application or go to your nearest satellite election office to register.

# STEP 2: Decide how you'll be voting

There are four primary ways to vote: in-person, by absentee ballot or by mail-in ballot (these last two are basically the same process in PA now) OR vote in-person (via mail-in ballot) at an early voting/satellite election office.

- In-person on November 3<sup>rd</sup>
  - Look up your assigned polling place
  - o Research the candidates, ballot questions and prepare yourself
  - o Grab your mask, a bottle of water and a charged phone
  - If this is your first time voting in PA, you MUST bring a photo or non-photo ID
  - See acceptable forms of identification <u>here</u>
  - Show up and VOTE!
  - PA Department of State Election Day Hotline for questions, concerns, problems on Nov. 3

- Absentee Voting. If you are registered in PA but currently out of the state or country
  - Apply for an absentee ballot here
- Mail-in Voting. How to get a ballot?
  - If you are living in your registered county but wish to vote by mail you are legally allowed to do so and are not required to submit a reason to do so
  - If you have a PA Driver's License or PennDOT ID number, you can apply online for a mail-in ballot <u>here</u>. Applications must be received by your <u>county</u> <u>election office</u> by 5pm on Tuesday, October 27, 2020. Please not this is a receipt deadline not a postmark deadline.
  - If you do not have a PA Driver's License or PennDOT ID number, you can print out and mail in a mail-in ballot paper application form. Download the application <a href="https://penseconder.org/length/">here</a>
- Mail-in Voting. How to do it?
  - The County Election Office will mail your ballot to the address you listed on your mail-in ballot application.
  - Research the candidates, ballot questions and mark your ballot.
  - VERY IMPORTANT....place your ballot in the secrecy envelope provided, then put the secrecy ballot in the official envelope AND make sure you sign the declaration on the outside of that envelope.
  - o THEN either
    - Mail your ballot to the Election Office to make sure it will be received (not postmarked) by Tuesday, November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 8pm [This deadline was just extended by 3 days by the PA Supreme Court BUT don't tempt fate or the USPS slowdown...mail early!]
    - Hand carry your ballot to a designated drop box OR to your county election office. [Sign up <a href="here">here</a> to get updates on drop box locations in your county.]
- NEW OPTION !!!! Mail-in Voting via in-person Satellite Election Office/Early Voting Site

- This week (week of Sept 20, 2020) City Election Officials are set to approve satellite election offices to support Philadelphia voters in the 2020 General Election
- Satellite offices will be open seven days a week from September 29<sup>th</sup> to November 3<sup>rd</sup>. Monday through Thursday, 11:30 to 6:30pm, Friday, Saturday, Sunday 9:30am to 4:30pm
- o Find the most convenient satellite office here
- Voters can register and update registration AND request, fill out and submit a mail-in ballots AND drop-off completed mail-in ballots
